AWARDS CLASSES - EMILY BENNET (CAPROW)

Additional Guidance on F Regulation Amendments

Regulations now stipulate that competition in AV/Stakes classes has no bearing on the main Breed competition at a show and it is therefore acceptable for beaten dogs to be eligible to challenge in Best Puppy In Group, Best In Group, Best Puppy In Show and Best In Show

Eligibility for Best Puppy in Group at Open Shows is now the same as General and Group Championship Shows, Only dogs declared Best Puppy in Breed and Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy are eligible to compete in the group and subsequently Best Puppy in Show. This applies to shows judged on the group system and not judged on the group system.

For shows not judged on the Group system it is at the discretion of the Show Society as to whether one Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified goes through to Best in Show or seven dogs one from each Any Variety Not Separately Classified group.

The attention of Open Show Societies is drawn to the fact that Best Puppy in Breed should be declared from the Breed classification, even if puppy classes are not scheduled.

The regulation preventing Best Puppy in show from competing in subsequent competition has been made redundant.

Dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show do not need to be withdrawn from subsequent competition.

MEMBERSHIP

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1 The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- 2 Dogs will be received until 12 noon and after which no dogs may be received except under exceptional and unforeseen circumstances and by special permission of the Show Management
- 3 Dog Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m. and Bitches to follow.
- 4 Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed.

The Show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.

- 5 ENTRY FEES:
 - £8.00 per Class (MEMBERS); Subsequent Classes £4.00 £9.50 per Class (NON-MEMBERS); Subsequent Classes £4.00 Not for Competition. Register dog as spectator on the day. Membership £6.00 Single, Joint £7.50 Enter online at www.onlineshowentry.com
- 6 Prize Money is not given at this show
- 7 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8 Puppies under four calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- 9 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and has been declared Best Puppy in Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified Puppy or Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register Puppy. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best of Breed or Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best of Breed or Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Breed and Best Puppy in Show respectively.

A Baby Puppy is a dog of four and less than six calendar months of age on the first day of the show. Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Any Variety Baby Puppy classes may be scheduled at any breed club show. Best Baby Puppy in Breed may be declared in each breed from the dogs entered in the Baby Puppy breed classes. There must be no progression to further competition

11 Best in Show

Best in Show and subsequent placing must be selected from those dogs declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified and Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

Best Veteran in show

Will be selected from those entered in Veteran Classes Only.

11 Best in Show

Best in Show and subsequent placing must be selected from those dogs declared Best of Breed, Best Any Variety Not Separately Classified and Best Any Variety Imported Breed Register.

- 12 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) -Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

- 16 <u>DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS</u> Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC
- licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the

- route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of
- · free flowing air around the dog

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

 Keep the dog in the shade - take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.

18 Not for Competition.

Not for Competition entries not accepted.

- No modifications will be made to the schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20 If you are paying by cheque, you are advised to ensure that there are sufficient funds in your account, as the Southern English Setter Society will levy a charge of £10.00 on each cheque returned, refer to drawer, to cover Bank and Administration charges.

Please write your Cheque Card Number on the back of cheque.

Failure to comply with the above will result in the matter being forwarded to the Kennel Club.

- i. Should any judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement, the Committee reserves to themselves the right of appointing other judges to fulfil their duties. soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches. Adequate receptacles for the disposal of such fouling will be provided.
- II. The Committee will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the dogs brought for exhibition but it must be clearly understood by exhibitors and all other persons at the Show that the Committee will not be responsible for the loss or damage to any Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be refunded.
- III. Any owner, competitor or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as
- iV. dogs or property, or personal injury whether arising from accident or any other cause whatsoever.
- V. An announcement prior to the date of closing of entries in Our Dogs of any alteration of addition made by the Committee to the schedule or in these Regulation shall be sufficient notice thereof.
- Vi. All children must be kept under control and parents will be held responsible for any damage caused and charges incurred.
- VII. Please do not obstruct gangways with cages, pens, grooming tables, trolleys and dogs. Storage space will be made available for trolleys/ cages.
- Viii. If in the opinion of the Show Secretary, Show Manager or Judge any dog is considered not in a fit state for exhibition owing to a disease, savage disposition, or any other cause, the dog may be excluded or removed from the show the dog must not be brought into the Show at any time under any circumstances.
 - IX. No animal other than an exhibit duly entered at the show will be allowed within the precincts of the show during its continuance.
 - X. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at a Kennel Club licensed event must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event)
 - Xi. A dog may be disqualified by the Board from any award, whether an objection has been lodged or not, if proved amongst other things to have been a) registered or recorded as having been bred by the scheduled judge, this shall not apply to a judge appointed in an emergency; b) exhibited without payment of the appropriate entry fees.
- Xİİ. Every exhibitor shall ensure that whilst the dog is being exhibited, its handler shall display the correct ring number.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the Rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club.

Wins at Championship shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of postal entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. 02/05/2025.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

(1) Withdrawal

The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F(1)19.

(2) Transfer

- a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or twenty-four calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of their being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.
- d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age

on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of

age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of

age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL YEARLING For dogs of six and not exceeding twenty-four calendar months

of age on the first day of the Show.

YEARLING For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty-four calendar

months of age on the first day of the Show.

BEGINNERS For owner, handler or exhibit not having won a first prize at a

Championship or Open Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge

Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor

Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether

restricted or not).

GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge

Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or four or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Graduate, Post Graduate, Minor

Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge

Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at

Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit,

Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under The

Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by The Kennel Club, or won 3 or more

CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge

Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and

eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of

the Show.

BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to

the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some

class other than Brace or Team.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F(B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule All.
- (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat.
- (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule All.
- 2.(a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
- (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof
 may be performed except:-
- (a) Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee
- (b) The removal of dewclaws of any breed
 (c) Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.
- 4. The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- 5. An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

The General Committee of the Kennel Club has approved a recommendation which requires exhibitors to display the exhibit/bench number on their crate, cage or container at all times. This is particularly important when cages etc are not on benches, and at un-benched shows.
